Lenten Practices and Sermon Series

We have entered the season of Lent, a season of penitence and reflection. It is also a season to put into practice new spiritual disciplines in order to deepen our faith and walk with Christ. One over-arching theme of Lent is that we are joining Jesus on his journey to the cross, so fasting and prayer are often very meaningful and appropriate practices to incorporate. It's also not too late to pick up a Lenten devotion, available in the church office and at the welcome centers, which contains a brief daily devotional reading.

Throughout March we will be continuing our Lenten series "Let Love Rise," which focuses on the entire bread-making process. Bread goes on quite a journey—from a single grain planted and nurtured, through the transformation of dough raising, to the final breaking and sharing of bread at a table. In this Lenten series we travel that same journey with one truth: Jesus offers us himself as the bread of life. Every time we share the bread and cup together, we proclaim the risen Christ. Join the journey toward rising and sharing that bread this Lenten season!

Holy Week begins with Palm Sunday on March 24. During the week we have two special worship services. The Maundy Thursday service is March 28 at 7:00 pm. We will continue our recent tradition of having the service in the gym and partaking of communion together around tables. This year, we will also focus on the events in the Garden of Gethsemane. The Good Friday Cantata is March 29 at 7:00 pm, and of course, Sunday, March 31, is Easter Sunday. I hope you will join us for as many of these special services as you are able.

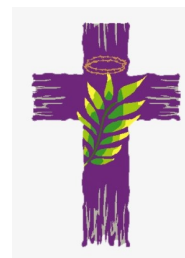

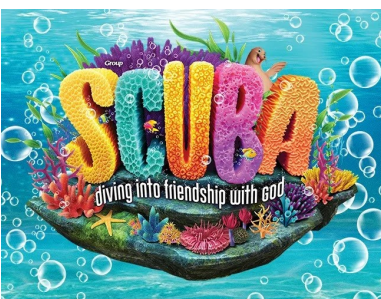

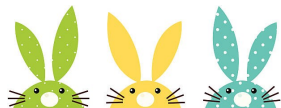

There are 32 niches in the columbarium of which 22 are sold. Each niche will hold two cremated remains and costs \$1000. That also includes the engraving on the niche door. 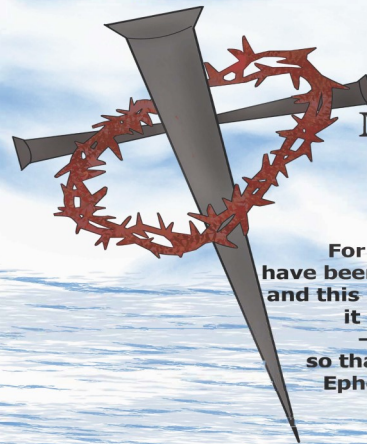
WHY DO WE HIDE EGGS AT EASTER?

In many pre-Christian societies, eggs held associations with spring and new life. Early Christians adapted these beliefs, making the egg a symbol of the resurrection and the empty shell a metaphor for Jesus' tomb. In the medieval period eating eggs was forbidden during Lent, the 40 day period before Easter. On Easter Sunday the fast ended with feasting and merriment, and eggs were considered an important part of these celebrations. This was especially true for poorer people who couldn't afford meat. Eggs were also given to the church as Good Friday offerings, and villagers often gave eggs as gifts to the lord of the manor at Easter. Royals got involved with this tradition too – in 1290 Edward I purchased 450 eggs to be decorated with colors or gold leaf and then distributed to his household.
