# FROM THE PASTOR



Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

At a recent continuing education event Ralph and I attended, we learned about a research project conducted to assess the degree of declining church attendance in our

country. Unfortunately, the survey revealed that "dechurching" is happening at an alarming rate—40 million people have stopped attending church regularly (defined as less than once a year) over the past 25 years. This is the largest religious shift in the history of our country so far. The news is even worse for the PC(USA) - since 1990, our denomination has lost 58% of our members.

But as we proclaimed the resurrection this past month, there is reason for hope. And the hope is this—there is some indication that for now, the trend of people choosing "none" on census forms is stabilizing at around 30%. But even more significantly, the research showed that while some have stopped attending because they had issues with their church, denomination, or the Christian faith in general, many who have stopped attending did not initially intend to do so. The researchers call them the "casually dechurched," and found the following contributing factors for why they had stopped attending: some

#### **Sermon Series**

In May, rather than one unifying theme, we have a variety of texts and topics that will be presented on Sundays. That Sunday we'll look at the Institution of the Passover, and on the first Sunday in June, we'll examine the Institution of the Lord's Supper.

moved to a new area; others had different priorities for their time and money; others felt they didn't fit with the congregation; for others a change in a life situation or COVID had gotten them out of the habit.

The good news was that for those surveyed with the above reasons for not coming to church, many just need a nudge such as a friendship with a church attender who invites them. The authors also suggest that they need to "see a gospel that isn't just true but is also good and beautiful." Friends, we are called to demonstrate that gospel in both word and deed. Prior to his departure, Jesus tasked his disciples to continue his mission in his physical absence. We find this in Matthew 28:18-20, which is expressed in just two words in our mission statement: "Share Christ."

I look forward to sharing more thoughts with you and with Session in the future! Those interested may want to check out the research in the book "The Great Dechurching" by Jim Davis and Michael Graham (Grand Rapids, Michigan: Zondervan, 2023).

Here's what is happening in the world of music at SPC.





# FOR THE BEAUTY OF THE EARTH

What better way to celebrate the month of May and the beauty of spring in Summerville, SC, than to sing about the beauty of the earth on which we live.

The natural beauty in Bath, England, in the spring of 1864, inspired Folliott Sanford Pierpoint to write one of Christianity's most beloved hymns of gratitude. Violets and primroses dotted the rolling countryside as he sat atop a hill.

Born in Bath in 1835, Pierpoint showed early promise as a scholar and writer. The hymn "For the Beauty of the Earth" was originally written for communion services.

Pierpoint crafted a beautiful progression from the physical beauty of creation to the spiritual beauty of the church. This hymn has seen numerous variations across denominations. These variations mean that the version our congregation knows and loves might be quite different from what's sung in a neighboring church. Yet somehow these differences only serve to make the hymn more accessible to a broader range of worshippers.

So, "Lord of all, to thee we raise, this our hymn of grateful praise!"


