

½ pound butter (no substitutes!), softened (salted is better)

1 cup confectioner sugar (aka, powdered sugar)



1/4 tsp salt

½ tsp genuine (real) vanilla

Preheat the oven to 350 degrees. Cream butter (that means beat it do death with a mixer), flour, salt, and vanilla. Grease (Pam is ok, but butter is ok too) a 7x11 pan (this would be a small lasagna pan/dish. A 9x9 will work too. Pat the dough into the pan/dish.
