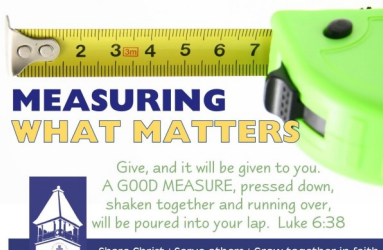

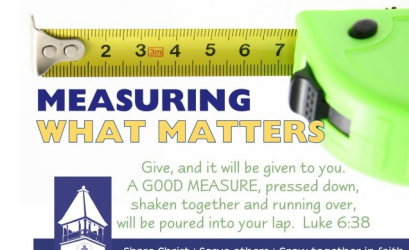

Cut immediately into small pieces (if you wait, it will be like cutting a cracker!). Remove from the pan when they are cool. DO NOT FREEZE (I don't know why, but don't do it). Store them at room temperature. Eat one and bring the rest to the church in a sealed container or zip-lock bag between October 20<sup>th</sup> and October 24<sup>th</sup>.
